



### Registration for AmeriCorps Program Eligibility Requirements

**Corps Members must bring the following documents to Registration Day to demonstrate that they are eligible to serve with AmeriCorps:**

1. Social Security Card
2. Government-Issued Photo ID
3. Proof of U.S. Citizenship or Legal Permanent Residence (bring one of the documents listed below)

#### **Proof of U.S. CITIZENSHIP:**

- A United States passport
- A birth certificate showing that the individual was born in one of the 50 states, the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico, Guam, the U.S. Virgin Islands, American Samoa, or the Northern Mariana Islands
- A certificate of birth-foreign service (FS 545) issued by the State Department
- A certification of report of birth (DS-1350) issued by the State Department
- A certificate of naturalization (Form N-550 or N-570) issued by the Immigration and Naturalization Service
- \* *A report of birth abroad of a U.S. Citizen (FS-240) issued by the State Department*
- \* *A certificate of citizenship (Form N-560 or N-561) issued by the Immigration and Naturalization Service*

#### **Proof of LEGAL PERMANENT RESIDENCE:**

- Permanent Resident Card or Alien Registration Receipt Card (INS Form I-551)
- A passport indicating that the INS has approved it as temporary evidence of lawful admission for permanent residence
- \* *A Departure Record (INS Form I-94) indicating that the INS has approved it as temporary evidence of lawful admission for permanent residence*

**All Corps Members must also bring documents that satisfy the I-9 requirements. The documents listed above are also valid for the I-9, except for documents listed with a \* symbol. If you are using a document marked with \* please check the [USCIS website](#) to see what other documents you may need to bring.**

All documents must be current and unexpired.

School IDs cannot be used in place of a Government-Issued ID

Birth certificates must be issued by a state, county, municipal authority, or outlying possession of the United States bearing an official seal. Birth Abstracts/Extracts are not acceptable.
