Many people use Braille or American Sign Language to communicate with each other in ways other than using your voice. When someone is missing their sense of sight, they might read with their sense of touch by feeling a set of raised dots, that are part of a special system called Braille. Many people who can't hear use American Sign Language to talk to each other.

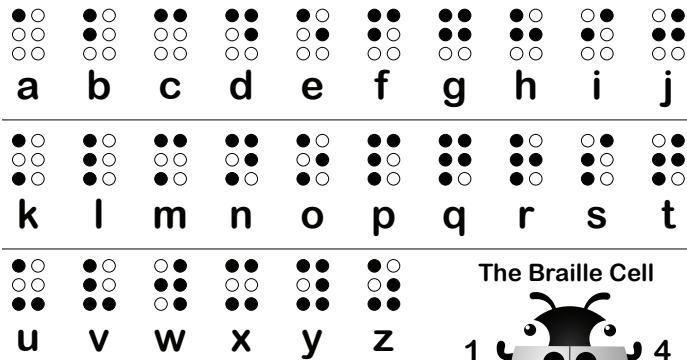
To get started you'll need:
