



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Letter from our CEO



Dear GSNETX families,

It is hard to believe that we are already talking about summer camp! Summer camp season is one of my favorite times to be a Girl Scout—for me, summer camp was where I learned independence, resilience, confidence, how to make new friends, physical and mental wellness, and so much more. Little did I know as a young Girl Scout how much those summer camp lessons would shape the person and leader I am today.

The good news is that the 2026 summer camp season is shaping up to be a great one. We will have sleepaway camp, family camp, troop camp, day camp, and twilight camp opportunities for every girl. And our goal is that your Girl Scout comes home with fun memories, new skills, and great friends, but also an eagerness to return year after year. I recognize that this year's camp signup might bring a sense of concern from our parents. Last summer's tragedy on the Guadalupe River has been weighing heavily on our hearts and minds for months. As parents of young girls, I know you need to be able to trust Girl Scouts of Northeast Texas to take the best care of your Girl Scout while she's with us at camp.

Since last summer, the state of Texas passed Senate Bill 1 (SB1), The Heaven's 27 Camp Safety Act, to ensure that camps are as prepared as possible for natural disasters and other emergencies. Girl Scouts of Northeast Texas is complying with the new requirements, including updating our emergency plans in partnership with local emergency responders, implementing the new property infrastructure requirements outlined in the bill, and submitting our emergency response plans for review with the Texas Department of State Health Services. As parents and guardians, you may start to notice increased transparency around emergency preparedness in some of our camp programs, such as evacuation route signage in cabins, public address systems for weather alerts at camp, and acknowledgement of emergency procedures in your camper's CampDoc health profile. The new legislation is effective this spring, and we will be fully compliant in advance of the 2026 summer camp season.

Fortunately, our camps were already accredited with the American Camp Association (ACA), a voluntary accreditation program to meet the highest standards for health, safety, staff training, and program quality. SB1 adds additional safety precautions, and we are committed to complying, as the safety of our girls is our highest priority.

We understand that health and safety are the highest priorities for you and your Girl Scouts, and we are committed to continual learning and proactive risk management for our entire camp community. Thank you for your trust in us.

Is Your Girl Ready for Week-Long Sleepaway Camp?

Deciding whether a Girl Scout is ready for sleepaway camp is a family responsibility. Your camper's success begins with managing expectations and evaluating the factors that will make the camp experience a positive one. We encourage caregivers to talk openly about the opportunities and challenges of sleepaway camp with their Girl Scout. Here are some questions that can help you decide if sleepaway camp is right for her at this time:

Ask your camper:

- Do you want to go to sleepaway camp?
- Are you eager to try new things and make friends?
- Have you had fun at sleepovers, and can you get yourself to sleep at night when away from home?
- Are you ready to stay in a diverse group environment that offers limited opportunities for privacy?
- Can you manage your own belongings and get dressed in activity-appropriate attire? (Getting in and of your swimsuit, for example.)
- Are you eager to experience independence in a safe, caring, fun environment?
- Can you manage your own hygiene, including bathing, toothbrushing, hair care, and applying sunscreen and bug spray?
- Are you committed to working through feelings of homesickness you might experience? (Our caring staff are prepared to help support our Girl Scouts through this natural response.)
- Both Girl Scout and caregiver: how will it feel to not have direct contact for a week—no phone calls, texts, email responses, or other direct updates? (Contact can be made in case of emergency.)
- Caregiver: Are you ready to let her go to a sleepaway camp?



Leadership Experiences at Camp Bette Perot



Counselor-in-Training (CIT) entering grade 9-12
CIT may be selected during the registration process.

There are three parts of the CIT leadership program:

1. Team-building and personal exploration with their peers
2. Assisting counselors with an activity of their choice
3. Mentoring with younger groups

Leadership activities fit around the regular camper experience, like activities and fun with friends. It's a great development opportunity for all girls—even if being a counselor is not in their future.

CIT 2 (CITs returning for a second summer) will have some new experiences and opportunities to learn more about camp behind the scenes.

Wrangler-in-Training (WIT) (application only) As a Wrangler-in-Training, you'll rise early and spend the day working with barn staff to catch, feed, saddle, and move horses from our herd. You'll work in the barn, help younger Girl Scouts on and off their horses, lead trail rides, and demonstrate turns, trot, and lope in arena classes. You'll also have the opportunity to enjoy camp favorites like swimming, archery, evening activities, and fun with friends! Applications will be available online in the spring of 2026. Must be 14 by start of camp and be able to saddle and bridle independently as well as be comfortable at a walk, trot, and lope.

Platform tents are the original Girl Scout camp experience and foster a camper's progression, grit, and accomplishment. The tents in Raccoon Ridge have wooden floors, wood support frames, heavy canvas roofs, giant fans, and beds equipped with bed nets, cubbies, and twinkle lights! Our counselors are ready to help campers conquer any challenges and learn what they are capable of.

Activity customization for grade 5 and up

When they get to camp, our older Girl Scouts get to customize their week by selecting their activities based on their interests and availability. Everyone will have barn time each day, but in other activity slots, she can customize her experience to focus on what interests her!

Buddy Requests

We attempt to honor one mutual buddy request between campers of the same grade level. A buddy can be comforting, but we also encourage all girls to make new friends. If you want to camp with a larger group, please explore Troop Camp at Camp Gambill.



Our camp staff provides memorable experiences while families and troop volunteers look after their Girl Scouts. Cabins in the Frog Unit sleep up to eight, and cabins in the Sleepy Unit can accommodate up to six. Select your cabin and pay according to the number of troop or family members. **Sessions run Thursdays through Sundays.**



Steps

1. Sign in to your ActiveNet account (or create an account), found on the Summer Camp page on our website.
2. Select the camp from the Summer Camp listings.
 - **Bette Perot Summer Camp**
 - **Gambill Summer Camp**
 - **Whispering Cedars Summer Camp**
 - **Day/Twilight Summer Camp**
3. Choose the week/session your camper will attend.
4. Select any add-ons or options.
5. Pay the \$100 non-refundable deposit to hold the spot for Summer Camps (Day/Twilight camp fees are due in full at the time of registration).
6. Choose your payment option:
 - **Pay in Full** — pay the remaining balance now
 - **Payment Plan** — 3 automatic charges on preset dates
 - If you would like to use **GS Bucks**, you will need to choose the payment plan option, then send a request to customer care@gsnetx.org to apply GS Bucks credit to your account. This can then be applied to your camp registration, and you will see your balance due decrease.
 - If you would like to **apply for a Campership** (financial aid), you will need to choose the payment plan option, then access the separate application on the website.
7. Complete transaction in ActiveNet.
8. Complete CampDoc forms (health, emergency contacts, medications, insurance, and consents).
Please note that our CampDoc forms are currently being finalized to further align with Senate Bill 1. Once available in March, everyone who is currently registered for Summer Camps will receive an invite email from CampDoc to complete your camp health profile.
9. Save confirmation emails/number for your records.
10. Manage payments anytime in ActiveNet — extra payments reduce your balance, automatic plan dates remain unless changed with the council.



Payment Options

You don't have to pay for camp all at once! After the \$100 non-refundable deposit, you can choose the payment option that works best for your family:

- **Pay in Full:** Pay the entire balance at registration.
- **Payment Plan:** Enroll in our three-installment automatic payment plan, with payments charged on preset dates.

You can still make additional payments anytime through your ActiveNet account. Balances can be paid with GS Bucks, and Campership (financial assistance) applications must be submitted at least six weeks before your camp session.
